- * Please state your reasons on the entry form if you cannot stay for the entire duration of the retreat.
- * Even if you are unsure about your participation, please submit the form by the given deadline.

9. Program Content

In order to promote discussion with the foreign researchers, the official language of this retreat is English.

(1) Poster Session

On the first day there will be a poster session. The purpose of this is to promote participants to communicate with people of various scientific background people which will help you to identify a lab of interest outside of your own, for Group Discussion.

(2) Group Discussion

On the second day, you will be placed in groups with people who selected the same labs. Each group will share why they find this lab interesting and together come to a better understanding of what it means. For this purpose, group members are encouraged to talk to members of the actual lab. You should also discuss new ideas which you will add to the understanding of this field.

On the final day, each group will make a presentation about their 2nd day discussion to the remaining participants. Members of the laboratory being discussed in particular should ask questions that will aid the discussion.

(3) Open Discussion

We will have a lecture from an expert. After the lecture, the speaker will ask questions to everyone. And you can respond to the question by agreeing or disagreeing followed by the explanation of your response.

Depending on the speaker, we may vary discussion style.

(4) Excursion

We will be organizing a short excursion and you can choose to join one of the two options:

- 1. A sightseeing tour of the sacred Enryaku temple on Mount Hiei.
- 2. A sightseeing tour of the historic Sakamoto, which includes one of Japan's oldest shirnes, Hiyoshi Taisha.

For those who do not speak Japanese, there are some members who have been specifically assigned to join these excursions to provide English explanation of the sites.
